#### August 09, 2009 - J STREET DRAIN PROJECT - SUMMARY

ALL OWNERS AND RESIDENTS OF SURFSIDE III need to be aware of a large Ventura County Public Works Project – already designed and planned - by the Ventura County Watershed Protection District (VCWPD) that will have a very significant negative effect on our community, our lives, and probably, on our financial status.

To protect the residents of Oxnard and Port Hueneme living in the Oxnard Flood Plain area near the J Street Drain (the canal that forms the eastern boundary of our property) from a "100 YEAR FLOOD EVENT", the VCWPD has planned a major expansion of the canal.

This will entail a large construction project that was planned in 2005 and is anticipated to start in January of 2010. The townhouse properties and condo buildings that border on the canal will be directly affected. And, if all damage to SSIII property is not compensated, then all members of the Association will be affected by the cost of remediation.

Unfortunately, we were not informed about the public meetings concerning this project that were held in January, 2008. Therefore, we had no opportunity to study the possible plan alternatives; discuss or input our comments regarding the plans; present any opposition; or propose any alterations to the plans, based on our environmental and financial interests that will be critically-affected.

#### At this point, we are concerned about the following effects on our property:

- removal of existing fence, trees and shrubbery that provide screening from the unsightly views, noise, and odors of the Water Treatment Facility across the canal which is required by the eight-foot work-area needed for the canal-expansion construction;
- dust, noise, parking issues, and other inconveniences caused by the construction activities;
- expenses to repair and replace damage to trees, vegetation, fence, walkways, planters, parking covers, electrical and water lines, etc.

#### **THE EVEN-MORE-IMPORTANT CONCERN IS:**

WHY – WHEN OUR ECONOMY IS IN RECESSION; OUR STATE IS BANKRUPT; OUR COUNTY IS CUTTING VITAL SERVICES AND WE ARE IN THE WORST DROUGHT IN HISTORY – ARE MILLIONS OF TAXPAYER DOLLARS BEING SPENT TO PROTECT US FROM A VERY-UNLIKELY 100 YEAR FLOOD EVENT???

As the VCWPD had failed to notify us of the public meetings, we were unable to participate in the initial planning process – which has now proceeded to the Final Planning phase. So, unless we are able to mobilize very-strong support against the project, we probably won't be able to stop it. Therefore, we have requested the VCWPD to work with us on a fair Restoration Plan to mitigate the environmental damage - and to provide reasonable compensation for any other losses to our community resulting from this project.
